

ORDINANCE NO. 269

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING THE 1999-2000 SALARY PLAN ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE NO. 211 ADOPTING THE 1999-2000 BIENNIAL BUDGET BY ADJUSTING THE MAINTENANCE WORKER SALARY RANGES

WHEREAS, on December 7, 1998, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 211 adopting the 1999-2000 Biennial Budget, Salary Schedule, and Benefits Plan, Authorizing Positions, and Appropriating Funds;

WHEREAS, on December 6, 1999 the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 257 revising the 1999-2000 Biennial Budget, including salary ranges; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2000 the City Council approved the labor agreement between the City and the International Union of Operating Engineers Local 612 relating to Public Works maintenance employees, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. 1999-2000 Salary Plan Amended. The 1999-2000 Salary Plan adopted as part of the 1999-2000 Biennial Budget in Ordinance No. 211 and amended by Ordinance No. 257, is hereby amended to adjust the 2000 Maintenance Worker salary ranges in conformance with the collective bargaining agreement as follows:

	<u>1999 Salary Range</u>	<u>2000 Salary Range</u>
Maintenance Worker I	\$2,176 - \$2,754 per mo.	\$2,246 - \$2,848 per mo.
Maintenance Worker II	\$2,647 - \$3,350 per mo.	\$2,683 - \$3,403 per mo.
Maintenance Worker III	\$2,700 - \$3,417 per mo.	\$2,737 - \$3,471 per mo.
Lead Maintenance Worker	\$3,062 - \$3,876 per mo.	\$3,106 - \$3,939 per mo.

Section 2. Publication and Effective Date. A summary of this Ordinance consisting of its title shall be published in the official newspaper of the City. This Ordinance shall be effective April 1, 2000.
