

City Hall is UP and Open!

Following Governor Jay Inslee's announcement that the State of Washington has officially reopened as of June 30, City of University Place offices are getting ready to begin resuming normal operations as well.

- Effective July 6, City Hall has reopened with inperson hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- The U.P. Police Department will reopen
 - to walk-in traffic beginning Monday, July 12. The front desk will be staffed from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. (closed for lunch from 11 a.m. to noon), with staff on hand to address questions and concerns related to public safety, how to obtain copies of a police report or to report a non-life-threatening crime.
- The Community and Economic Development Department will be open in person but, given the small staff, those who wish to stop by are encouraged to call or **email** in advance to set up a time to meet and ensure someone will be available to assist them.



With in-person visits now permitted, all City of U.P. offices and departments will operate pursuant to U.S. Centers for Disease Control, Washington State Health Department and Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department directives.



Council Member Keel Elected President of Washington Association of Cities

University Place Council Member Kent Keel has been



elected president of the **Association of Washington Cities** (AWC) Executive Committee for 2021-2022. He served as the group's vice president for the past year and has been a member of the AWC Board of Directors since 2014.

"It is my honor and pleasure to serve as AWC's president and to be a strong advocate for all cities and towns in our state," Keel said. "Our voice is clear, direct, and resolute. AWC is on a great path!"

The AWC Board of Directors is comprised of 25 directors, 23 of whom are elected officials (mayors or councilmembers) from Washington cities, and two non-elected city officials who also serve as the

president and past president of the Washington City/County Management Association.

AWC serves its members through advocacy, education, and services. Founded in 1933, AWC is a private, nonprofit, nonpartisan corporation that represents Washington's cities and towns before the state legislature, the state executive branch, and with regulatory agencies. AWC consistently maintains 100 percent participation from Washington's 281 cities and towns.

I am continually amazed that Jennifer Hales, our public safety administrator, manages to make it happen, year after year. As you can imagine, it takes hours and hours of planning to put the puzzle pieces together, which is why it is critical that if

your neighborhood would like us to stop by, make sure you register by **emailing Jennifer** by July 23.

We've missed seeing everyone and are anxious to reconnect on Aug. 3. But until then, and as always, stay safe.

What do I need to know about each kind of vaccine?

Vaccines provide excellent protection against severe illness or death from COVID-19. That means a vaccine is your best chance of returning to normal life.

Each is a little different, but your best choice is the vaccine that's available to you now.

- Pfizer:
 - Authorized for people 12 years or older.
 - Requires 2 doses at least 21 days apart.
- Moderna:
 - Authorized for people 18 years or older.
 - Requires 2 doses at least 28 days apart.
- Johnson & Johnson:
 - Authorized for people 18 years or older.
 - Requires 1 dose.



- The U.S. Centers for Disease Control offers the latest facts and information about COVID-19, including information on travel and return to school or work.
- The **Governor's Office** provides details about on-going response efforts throughout the State of Washington, including the State's Risk Assessment Dashboard.
- The **Washington State Department of Health** provides updated statistics on the occurrence of COVID-19 across the State, as well as testing data.
- The Tacoma-Pierce County Department of Health and Pierce County Government provide important local information on testing sites, phased re-opening status and CARES Act funding to support recovery efforts.
- The City of University Place's dedicated COVID-19 info page includes valuable information on resources for businesses and residents, such as local school meal sites and Tacoma Public Utilities' contact information for payment plans or assistance.
