

RESOLUTION NO. 288

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING
PUBLIC WORKS PERMIT AND SERVICES FEES**

WHEREAS, by ordinance, the City has authorized fees and charges for services provided by the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to recover the cost of services where fees may be appropriate;

WHEREAS, the City recognizes the need to amend the existing Public Works Permits and Service Fees by 3%; NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE,
WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Public Works Permits and Service Fees Amended. Public Works Permits and Service Fees are hereby amended as set forth in Schedule 'A' attached and made a part of this resolution.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption, with fees effective January 1, 2001.

| Residential Inspection | *2% of Estimated Total Project Cost |
| Investigation Fees / Work Without a Permit | Per section 107 of the Uniform Building Code, current edition |

*An itemized project cost estimate shall be prepared and stamped by a licensed professional engineer and submitted to the City for approval. This engineer's estimate shall be used to determine the project cost.
