

RESOLUTION NO. 317

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 146 ESTABLISHING A COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING STRATEGY (COPS), INCLUDING AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND ITS SUPPORTING STRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, on May 5, 1997, the City Council passed Resolution No. 146 establishing the University Place COPS Advisory Committee to implement the City's Community Oriented Policing Strategy and to promote public safety throughout the community;

WHEREAS, on March 16, 1998, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 172 amending Section 7, Vacancies and Removal of Members;

WHEREAS, on April 6, 1998 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 175 adding two positions to the COPS Advisory Committee

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined the need to adjust the make up of the COPS Advisory Committee in light of recent community and organizational changes; NOW, THEREFORE,


BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 4. Membership, of Resolution No. 146, Amended. The City Council amends Section 4 of Resolution No. 146 to read as follows:

Section 4. Membership. There shall be eleven members of the COPS Advisory Committee. The Committee shall be comprised of one representative from each of the following: business (or at-large if there is a lack of applicants from the business community), school, fire district, and church/social services community (or at-large if there is a lack of applicants from the church/social service community). There shall be ~~four Neighborhood Zone and three~~ seven at-large representatives. In addition, one police department and one City staff representative shall also serve as non-voting members of the committee. The City Council may designate alternates that may participate on the Committee if the primary member cannot attend.

Section 2. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
