Chambers Creek Bridge Ribbon Cutting

The City of University Place and the City of Lakewood, in conjunction with Pierce County, held a special ribbon cutting ceremony on Saturday, Dec. 18 for the new pedestrian bridge over Chambers Creek that links the two cities.

Located just west of Kobayashi Park, the bridge spans Chambers Creek Canyon, which is part of Pierce County's Chambers Creek Regional Park. With the bridge complete, pedestrians can now



travel from Lakewood to the Kobayashi trailhead. This safe, walkable and modern span is designed to prevent hikers from traversing across the creek, which can be dangerous and lead to environmental damage as well. The three trail partners are now focusing their collective efforts on completing design on the next phase of the trail that will include another bridge. When complete, hikers will be able to continue on to connect with trails that ultimately lead to Chambers Creek Regional Park.


