Ride with ORCA to U.P. Special Events

Pierce Trips, a carpooling, public transit and telework resource, has provided the City of University Place with 100 ORCA regional transit cards to help those with limited incomes or transportation options get to and from special events in University Place at no cost.

Those who are interested in obtaining an ORCA card will be asked to complete the **online form** and indicate which special events they wish to attend:

The passes will be issued on a first-come, first-serve basis. Each pass has enough fare to cover two All Day Passes (or five one-way trips). Households will be limited to no more than four passes. If your pet is not yet licensed, simply complete the licensing paperwork and pay the fee, which includes discounts for all pets that are spayed/neutered as well as reduced fees for pets of senior and disabled residents. Then take a picture with their license and share it!

Per City ordinance, all pets eight weeks and older are required to be licensed in the City of U.P. License fees fund Pierce County's Animal Control services which assist with lost or stray animals, abused animals, barking dogs and leash law violations.

Emergency Food Network Offers Home Delivery

Residents of U.P. who are unable to access local food pantries because of transportation or accessibility issues are encouraged to reach out to the The Pierce County Emergency Food Network, which has a Home Delivery program for Pierce County residents who have barriers to accessing their local food pantries



including issues such as limited mobility or transportation, prohibitive work schedules or quarantine due to COVID-19, to name a few.

The Emergency Food Network (EFN) includes more than 70 food pantries and hot meal sites, providing meals to over 1.9 million clients annually. The majority of food is donated by farms and large corporations such as Fred Meyer, Carolina Logistics, QFC, and SuperValu, but EFN also acts as a Sub-Distributing Agency (SDA) for the USDA Commodity Food Program and purchases food through its Co-op Food Purchasing Program.

Earth Day Work by Rotary Club of UP-Fircrest Spruces UP U.P. Post Office

Rotary Clubs of Pierce County celebrated Earth Day this year with a variety of environmentally oriented projects. UP-Fircrest Rotary members gathered on April 24, at the U.P. Post Office on 27th Street, to continue last fall's initial Labor Day cleanup, where the Club had tackled 20 years of deferred landscape maintenance. The UP-Fircrest Club began at 9 a.m. on Sunday morning, performing spring cleanup, much less extensive than they faced in the fall. The focus this year was on areas less obvious to patrons, such as the employee parking lot at the rear of the building, which had become home to overgrown blackberry vines.

Among its other activities, the Club has recently held multiple food drives with help from Safeway and Fred Meyer stores, and honored Curtis Junior High School Students of the Month for many years. They have also provided baseball scoreboards at Cirque Park and computers and printers at the U.P. Library Teen Center. A listing of international projects can be found at the **Club's website**.

Until 2021, the Club was known as Tacoma Narrows Rotary, but clubs need to have a name that indicates their service area. As the number of clubs in Pierce County grew, it became important to change the Club's name to more closely mirror its service area. Meetings are continuing to be held via Zoom, and a meeting invitation can be found at the Club's website for community members who'd like to attend.

They take just a few minutes of your time and provide the City with a clear message of how our U.P. community feels about the given topic.


