This vision can be a guiding force as the City develops policies and regulations. The City's "Vision Statement" was last revised in 2004 and it states:

Violence is not tolerated. in-depth feasibility study to gather input on plans to revitalize Cirque Park. There will be a total of three separate surveys that the public can respond to, including a FlashVote survey that will go out in early December. There will also be a series of public meetings and presentations to community stakeholders about the project.

35th Street Improvements Underway

Work has begun on the construction of new sidewalks, bike lanes, streetlighting and landscaping along both sides of 35th Street between 67th Avenue and Bridgeport Way. In addition, an improved crosswalk with pedestrian-actuated flashing beacons will be installed across 35th Street at Morrison Road.



The project's contractor is currently clearing vegetation to make room for the

new sidewalks. This will be followed by retaining wall construction and utility relocation. The work is anticipated to be completed by early summer 2024. This project is funded through a \$2 million grant from the Federal Highway Administration.

The City will review all the local applications and select a nominee to forward to the Center for Quality Communities for consideration. Scholarship recipients will be notified in April 2024 by AWC.



City Invests in Two New Electric Vehicles

The City of University Place recently purchased two new 2023 Ford F150 Lightning electric vehicles to replace two 2006 Ford F250 trucks with traditional internal combustion engines. The new vehicles will be used by the Public Works Department.



"The City is working toward adding electric and hybrid vehicles to our fleet when it makes sense. These are the first two trucks the City has purchased towards that goal," said Tony West, the City's Public Works Operations manager, noting that some larger trucks and equipment do not have zero-emission vehicles (ZEV) or low emission vehicle (LEV) equivalents yet. "Washington State has adopted California's 2035 ZEV vehicle mandate, and while these vehicles present somewhat of a higher initial cost, long-term savings on maintenance, fuel and to our environment will offset that."
