

Parking Meters Arriving in the Village at Chambers Bay Soon


U.P.'s Public Works crews are finishing up the installation of new 90-minute parking meters along Market Place West in the Village at Chambers Bay.

The parking fee is \$0.50 for the first half hour. Additional 15-minute increments are \$0.25, with the fee being \$1.50 for the full 90 minutes allowed. The metered rates are active from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekdays and Saturdays. Parking is free on Sundays and holidays. The ADA stalls are not metered.

Parkers can pay using coins, credit cards or the PaybyPhone app. For



The new meters are intended to ensure a fair and equitable turnover of parking spots for those patronizing businesses in the Village, especially for those with accessibility and mobility issues.



What is Your Vision for the Four Corners?

Within the next 20 years, Sound Transit plans to extend the Tacoma Link light rail to the intersection South 19th and South Mildred streets (known to many as "the Four Corners"). The new station will connect Tacoma Community



College to Sea-Tac International Airport, Seattle and points further north in King County.

The project is sure to spur additional economic development opportunities but will also have impacts for businesses and residents. A group of local partners, including Pierce Transit, Tacoma Community College, Tacoma Housing Authority and area cities are encouraging residents and business owners to share their hopes, visions—and concerns—about how this will affect the Four Corners area.

Don't be a Dud: Obey U.P.'s Fireworks Ordinance

Now that summer is upon us, it won't be long before fireworks stands begin to appear across Pierce County. This is a reminder that discharging fireworks in University Place is **only**

legal between the hours of 9 a.m. to midnight on July 4.

Only non-aerial and non-explosive fountains, cones, novelties (snakes, poppers), smoke balls and sparklers are legal in U.P. If you purchase fireworks sold from stands outside of U.P., be sure they meet these requirements.

Violations of U.P.'s fireworks regulations could result in fines of up to \$250 plus fees, costs and assessments.
