Work Begins on Phase 2 of Chambers Creek Canyon Trail

Officials from Pierce County, University Place and Lakewood broke ground on Phase 2 of the **Chambers Creek Canyon Trail** on May 31. This phase of the trail project focuses on the north side of the canyon from the Zircon Road trailhead to Chambers Creek's confluence with Leach Creek. When complete, there will be two new timber crossings between the north and south sides of the canyon and 2,000 linear feet of boardwalk that will ultimately connect Lakewood and University Place.



Phase 1 was completed in December 2020 with the installation of a new bridge crossing that connects the City of Lakewood to University Place near Kobayashi Park. A one-mile portion of the trail was also constructed between the Chambers Creek Dam and Zircon Road trailheads.

Important Fireworks Reminders

With Independence Day just around the corner, U.P. residents are reminded that the only fireworks legal for discharge in University Place are non-aerial and non-explosive fountains, cones, novelty (snakes, poppers), smoke balls and sparklers. Fireworks can only be discharged in the city on July 4 from 9 a.m. to midnight. For

If you want to report fireworks violations, visit **FireworksReport.com** between **June 28 through July 7** to report violations to South Sound 911. Online reporting is easy. Simply provide a valid address where the violation occurred, the complainant's name, and phone number. The information is then made

available to law enforcement agencies electronically or over the radio.

July 4 is the single busiest day for South Sound 911 call takers and dispatchers when call volumes often double. In 2022, residents submitted 909 complaints via **FireworksReport.com**. This saved approximately 45 hours of dispatcher's time, allowing 911 call takers to focus on true emergencies, including emergencies resulting from fireworks, such as fires and injuries.

Get Ready for National Night Out

Get to know your neighbors and build community connections that deter crime by organizing a neighborhood National Night Out celebration on Tuesday, Aug. 6.

Every year since the City was incorporated in 1995, U.P. residents have joined with neighborhoods across the country by participating in this event designed to encourage safe communities. In the past, U.P. residents have held everything from casual potlucks to block parties and cookouts.



One of the highlights of the event is the Public Safety Caravan, when members of the U.P. Police Department, West Pierce Fire & Rescue, City Council members and City staff stop by in their public safety vehicles to join in the neighborhood celebrations. Share the Road

Summer means more and more people are out enjoying the beautiful weather, so it is especially important for motorists to obey Washington law that requires them to yield to all those on foot and wheel (bikes, scooters, etc.) in marked crosswalks.



But did you know that motorists must also stop at unmarked crossings? State law says all roadway intersections are legal crossings for pedestrians regardless of whether they are marked or not.

Motorists should follow these basic rules at marked and unmarked crosswalks:

- Watch for people walking or "rolling" at all times, in all places
- Obey posted speed limits—and slow down when sharing the road with walkers or riders
- Give people a brake who are walking or rolling at unmarked corners
- Respect yellow lights instead of speeding up, slow down.
