# **Important Fireworks Reminders**

With Independence Day just around the corner, U.P. residents are reminded that the only fireworks legal for discharge in University Place are non-aerial and nonexplosive fountains, cones, novelty (snakes, poppers), smoke balls and sparklers. Fireworks can only be discharged in the city on July 4 from 9 a.m. to midnight. For more information, visit Fireworks Rules & Guidelines on the City's website www.cityofup.com or email UPPublicSafety@cityofup.com with questions.

If you want to report fireworks violations, visit FireworksReport.com between June 28 through July 7 to report violations to South Sound 911. Online reporting is



easy. Simply provide a valid address where the violation occurred, the complainant's name, and phone number. The information is then made available to law enforcement agencies electronically or over the radio.

July 4 is the single busiest day for South Sound 911 call takers and dispatchers when call volumes often double. In 2022, residents submitted 909 complaints via **FireworksReport.com**. This saved approximately 45 hours of dispatchers time, allowing 911 call takers to focus on true emergencies, including emergencies resulting from fireworks, such as fires and injuries.

# Fireworks Do's & Don'ts

### D0:

- Keep fireworks out of children's reach. \*Only adults should light fireworks.
- Keep pets indoors and fireworks outdoors.
- Protect your eyes.
- Make sure children under 16 are under direct adult supervision.

### DON'T:

- Throw fireworks or hold in your
- Light more than one firework at a time.
- Relight a "dud."
- Shoot off fireworks without water handy. Be sure to soak used fireworks in water.
