Within the next 20 years, Sound Transit plans to extend the Tacoma

Link light rail to this intersection. The new station will connect Tacoma Community College to Sea-Tac International Airport, Seattle and points further north in King County.

Residents and business owners are encouraged to complete a **brief 10-question survey** to share their hopes, visions—and concerns—about how this will affect the Four Corners area. The survey will close July 31.

#### **Summer Weather Preparedness**

When things start to heat up outside, follow these tips to stay cool and avoid **heat-related illnesses**:

- If you don't have air conditioning, go to a public place like the library, museum or shopping mall.
- Never leave children or pets alone in hot vehicles, where the temperature can rise as much as 20 degrees in just 10 minutes.
- During extreme heat, check on family, friends and neighbors who do not have air conditioning and who spend much of their time alone.
- Use awnings or curtains to reduce the heat that enters your home through windows.
- Avoid using the oven during extreme heat advisories and warnings.
- Drink plenty of water to stay well-hydrated during extreme temperatures.
