Don't Let Porch Pirates Spoil Your Holidays

If you have done a lot of online shopping this holiday season, the U.P. Police Department offers these tips to avoid package theft:

- Check the package tracking provided by the seller so you know when to expect your delivery.
- Install a video doorbell with an alert that lets

- you know when someone has come to your door. Some systems allow you to speak to the person, which can deter would-be thieves.
- Have your packages delivered to secure pick-up locations.
- Require signature on delivery so that packages are not left without your knowledge.
- If you have to be away from home, ask neighbors to take in any packages they see left at your door.
- Remember that pirates don't just hit porches. Protect valuables in your vehicles by hiding them in the trunk. Always lock the doors and park in well-lit locations.



Glass Recycling Still Available in U.P.

Although some local cities are no longer accepting glass bottles and jars for recycling, **U.P. Refuse and Recycling** is still accepting it at their facility at 2815 Rochester St. (one block off 27th behind Cheers West). The recycling center is open Monday-Friday from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 7 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Are You Ready for Old Man Winter?

Freezing temperatures, heavy precipitation and gusty winds can lead to power disruptions, treacherous driving and dangerous outdoor conditions. Make sure you're ready for what the next few months have in store by following these basic tips:



- Make sure your home's insulation, caulking and weather stripping are in good condition and make necessary repairs.
- When winter weather is forecasted, make sure you have enough supplies (including medications and pet food) to last for several days.
- Have extra batteries for radios and flashlights if the power goes out.
- Only use generators and grills outdoors and away from windows. Never heat your home with a gas stovetop or oven.
- Install and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups.
- Sign up for Code RED Alerts to stay informed of the dangers in our area.
- Avoid driving in the worst conditions. If you must hit the road, have a full tank of gas, jumper cables, sand, a flashlight, warm clothes, blankets, bottled water and non-perishable snacks in your trunk.
- Watch for black ice, which can be dangerous for both drivers and pedestrians.


