

Septic/Pump Tank Decommissioning Guide



Decommissioning Purpose and Regulations

On-site sewage systems need to be properly abandoned to minimize potential health and safety hazards. Washington State Department of Health Rules and Regulations WAC 246-272A and Tacoma-Pierce County Board of Health Resolution 2014-4414:

Persons permanently removing a septic tank, sewage pit, cesspool or other container from service shall:

1. Have the septage removed by a certified O&M Firm approved for pumping.
 2. Remove or destroy the top of the tank lid(s).
 3. Remove the tank or fill the void space of the tank with soil or gravel.
 4. Submit this form with a site plan and fee to Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department
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Section 1.

If you intend to connect to public sewers, but have not yet decommission the septic tank(s):

1. Complete a plan review application with your public sewer utility provider (if required) and obtain a sewer application number (if applicable).
2. Complete only section 1 of this form. Submit with a site plan showing the location of the decommissioned tank and fee. Provide a copy or receipt to your sewer utility provider.
3. Once the sewer utility provider approves your sewer connection, you can decommission the tank and complete and submit section 2 of this form.

Section 2.

If you have decommissioned the septic tank(s) and are not installing new tank(s):

Complete section 2 of this form. Submit a site plan showing the location of the decommissioned tank(s) and fee.

(If you previously submitted section 1 of this form with a site plan and paid the fee, you do not need to submit a site plan or fee again. Submit this form as a resubmittal to the existing Decommissioning application or email it to: Ehsepticssystems@tpchd.org.)

If you have an approved Repair or Remodel application to install a new tank and decommission an old tank:

Complete section 2 of this form and submit it as a resubmittal to the Remodel or Repair application in process or email it to: Ehsepticssystems@tpchd.org. (A Decommissioning Certificate associated with a Repair or Remodel application does not require a fee.)

Submittal package must include:

1. Septic/Pump Tank Decommissioning Certificate form. (If submitting section 2, a licensed contractor must sign)
2. Application fee. (if applicable)
3. Site Plan indicating location(s) of the decommissioned tank(s) in relation to existing structures. If possible, show all tanks on the property. View Basic Site Plan requirements under the Environmental Health On-Site Sewage Regulations Chapter 2, Section 28. (Can use GIS map if appropriately labeled per basic site plan requirements.)
4. Pumping receipt from Certified Installation or O&M Firm approved for pumping. (if tanks were pumped).
5. Public Sewer application number. (if connecting to a public sewer line)
