

# **Show Your Love: Parks Appreciation Day is April**19





The City of University Place has more than 20 parks and open spaces for residents to enjoy throughout the year. On Saturday, April 19 you can show your appreciation for those spaces by spending a few hours providing a little TLC to Colegate Park, a 12-acre undeveloped natural site located just north of Curtis High School.

Volunteers are needed to perform trail maintenance, weeding and other general cleanup of the park from 9 a.m. to noon. They will also help plant a tree at the site in honor of Arbor Day.

University Place Refuse and Recycling will provide volunteers with snacks, water and t-shirts in the staging area behind the school tennis courts. Participants are encouraged to bring their own tools and gloves (make sure they are labeled with owner information). The City will provide additional rakes and shovels for those who do not have their own.

#### What's Up With Biz

During a special workshop on March 24, U.P. Police Department Community Outreach Officer Cory Shears and a representative from the Pierce County Sheriff's Office invited local business owners to share their challenges with shoplifting and learn some of the best techniques for how to prevent the crime.

By sharing their experiences and questions, the attendees were able to learn from others' experiences while also



connecting directly with UPPD officers, including the department's investigator, who were also on hand for the event.

"We want to help open the lines of communication between our business owners and our patrol officers so that they know us and we know them," said Shears.

"UPPD takes shoplifting seriously and we want to work with the business community to track trends and repeat offenders so we can shut it down quickly."

#### **Sunset Terrace Park Improvements Wrapping Up**





Enhancements to improve parking and pedestrian accessibility at Sunset Terrace Park (1902 Seaview St. W.) are nearly complete.

The park's existing gravel parking area has been paved and widened to allow pedestrians a safe and stable pathway to the park. The park and its playground are open, but restoration of the field is still in progress and is anticipated to be completed in a few weeks, depending on the weather.

When the field restoration work is complete, the area will need to be temporarily fenced off from the public to allow the grass to re-establish. The goal is to have the field fully functional by this summer.




#### **Poetry Walk at Adriana Hess Wetland**
